The GTCCC competition represents the work of 20 clubs throughout the greater Toronto Area. The Richmond Hill Club took second honours in each of the Colour and Monochrome print categories.

Richmond Hill Camera Club meetings run on alternate Mondays from September to May. During meetings we exchange information, learn new techniques, and show one another the results of our work. We conduct 7 competitions a year where our photographers submit images for judging and receive scores

contributing to end of season awards. We also actively conduct workshops to teach new techniques and have informal get togethers to talk about images and photography and help one another improve.

If you want to get more out of your photography, learn new skills and generally have a great time with people who enjoy cameras and photography, then join the club! Annual memberships are inexpensive (about \$50 per year). You can participate in bi-weekly meetings, workshops, fieldtrips and competitions. For some workshops and fieldtrips there is an added cost to cover the club's expenses. RHCC is a non-profit, Richmond Hill based community organization dedicated to promoting photography.

represent all walks of life but they share a deep interest in photography. They compete in one of three skill levels - Novice, Intermediate or Advanced. These images are mixed by skill level and as you can see they demonstrate our members' wonderful accomplishments. They take photographs mostly with point-and-shoot cameras, digital SLR's and in some cases use conventional negative film. They use all brands of equipment. These spectacular results show it's not the equipment that's important - but the skill and passion of the photographer.
